ISSUE: The City Commission will take public comment and consider a proposed text amendment to the Land Development Regulations regarding food trucks.

ANALYSIS: In August 2022, staff requested the City Commission table a proposed Ordinance regarding food trucks to a later date to allow for further research and to comply with State Statutes. State Statute preempts local governments from requiring a separate license, registration, or other permit or fees other than the license required by the State, and from prohibiting mobile food vendors/food trucks from operating within the entirety of the City. Currently, the City does not have Land Development Regulations to define or allow for food trucks within City limits. Staff has conducted research to provide definitions in Chapter 4 and guidelines in Chapter 5 of the Land Development Regulations to allow for food trucks within certain uses.

The proposed Ordinance adds regulations to Chapter 5 that would provide the intent, applicability, permitting and location requirements for food trucks. Food trucks would be allowed at permitted use locations only including tourism destinations, breweries, and for approved special events.

Food Trucks associated with a Special Event shall only be allowed to operate in accordance with a Special Event approval two times a calendar year, for the duration of one day, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m., at a planned activity by a group, such as a HOA, a sporting event, business grand openings, and festivals that are open to the general public as approved by the City's Community Development Department. Food Trucks are prohibited from operating on public property and rights of way, unless approved by the City.

The proposed Ordinance was prepared by the Community Development Department and reviewed by the City Manager and City Attorney. The proposed Ordinance was approved on first reading May 20, 2024, and is being considered for second and final reading.

ISSUE: The City Commission will consider Ordinances amending the Police Officers' Pension Plan and the Firefighters' Pension Plan.

ANALYSIS: The proposed Ordinances amend Section 27, Deferred Retirement Option Plan (DROP), of the Police Officers' Pension Trust Fund and the Firefighters' Pension Trust Fund. The interest rate for the DROP in the Florida Retirement System was increased to 4% on July 1, 2023. The Board of Trustees for the Police Officers' Pension Plan and Firefighter's Pension Plan recommend this change to help retain and attract police officers and firefighters.

The actuary of the plans, Foster & Foster, issued letters indicating that there are no costs associated with the adoption of the proposed Ordinances. The proposed Ordinances were prepared by the Pension Plan Attorney for the plans, Christiansen & Dehner, P.A., and reviewed by the Finance Director, City Manager and City Attorney. The proposed Ordinances were approved on first reading May 20, 2024, and are being presented for second and final reading.

ISSUE: The City will consider the proposed Capital Outlay Section of the Fiscal Year 2025 and Fiscal Year 2026 Annual Budgets.

ANALYSIS: In preparation of the proposed FY 2025 and FY 2026 Annual Budgets, Department Directors were requested to revisit all the Capital projects previously approved by the City Commission in the second-year budget (FY 2025) and the 5-Year Capital Improvement Program (CIP). This helps to determine if the equipment or improvements are still needed, could be delayed, and/or has a funding source.

The proposed FY 2025 Capital Outlay section reflects expenditures of \$35,689,452. FY 2026 includes Capital Outlay projects totaling \$13,004,817.

Specific improvements in FY 2025 include:

Public Utility Department Capital Outlay:

- . Southern Force Main Re-route Construction = \$3,400,000
- . Effluent Disposal Design = \$2,970,000
- . Northern Force Main Construction = \$2,800,000
- . Hickory Road Sprayfield Construction = \$1,700,000
- . Allred WWTP New Digester = \$1,000,000
- . Pace Road Master Liftstation Construction = \$710,000
- . Replacement Vactor Truck = \$650,000
- . PRWC Alternative Water = \$610,344
- . Clinton / Bridgers Ave Gravity Sewer Replacement = \$600,000
- . Oakland AC Water Main Replacement = \$500,000
- . Utility System Rehabilitation = \$500,000
- . Regional WWTP Centrifuge Replacement = \$500,000

General Fund and Community Redevelopment Agency Capital Outlay:

- . Lake Ariana Civic Center Design/Build = \$8,775,000

General Fund and Community Redevelopment Agency Capital Outlay:

- Design & Reserve for Splash Pad = \$1,000,000

- . Replacement Fire Pumper (2005) = \$761,164
- . Purchase Various Vehicles for Police Dept. (8 New) = \$625,737
- . Fire Station #2 Design and Engineering = \$500,000
- . Lake Ariana Park Facility Equipment = \$500,000
- . Reserve for Main Street Streetscape = \$500,000
- . Auburndale TECO Trail Resurfacing = \$350,000

All items in "year one" and "year two" of the revised 5-year CIP have been programmed into the proposed two-year budget.
